BIRMINGHAM

Birmingham is the most populous British city outside of London with 1,074,300 residents. It rose to international prominence in the 18th century during the Midlands Enlightenment and the subsequent Industrial Revolution, putting it at the forefront of worldwide advances in science, technology, and economics. By 1791, it was described as the 'first manufacturing town in the world'.

Today, Birmingham is a major international commercial centre with a GDP of \$90 billion, and with everything from royal ballet and international art collections to premiership football and international cricket, world-class theatre and cuisine, there is something for everyone here. Birmingham is home to six leading universities and houses major cultural institutions such as the Birmingham Royal Ballet, City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, and the Barber Institute of Fine Arts. The city is also home to the world class Edgbaston Cricket Ground. Among the city's many other attractions are the jewellery quarter – the largest jewellery making centre in Europe, and more parks, open spaces, and canals than any other city in Europe.

Birmingham lies at the very heart of the UK and is a major hub for British and international business. As well as great road and rail connections, its airport provides a link to over 100 national and international destinations, making it one of the most accessible cities in the UK.

CONGRESS VENUE

The ICC is located on the site originally occupied by Bingley Hall, the world's first purpose built exhibition hall. Building work was started in 1984 and took almost 4 and half years to complete. The ICC was officially opened by H.M. Queen Elizabeth II in June 1991 and has since hosted many important meetings including the G8 summit in 1998 and the Conservative Party's annual conference in 2008 and 2010.

As a state of the art building, the ICC has won several design awards, which include the Institution of Civil Engineers Project Award in 1992.

The ICC is located only 8 miles from Birmingham International Airport and is minutes away from the heart of Birmingham, offering easy access to all of the city's top hotels and attractions.
