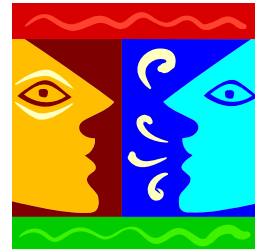


Terms Used by Family/Friend Caregivers to Describe Incontinence and Related Skin Damage in Their Care Recipient



Terms Used by Family/Friend caregivers to Describe Either Urinary or Fecal Incontinence

Leaking	It gets away from them
Accident	They lose control
Incontinence	They need to go to the bathroom

Terms Used by Family/Friend caregivers to Describe Fecal Incontinence

Bowel problem	They soil their pants
Loose bowels	They mess their pants
Diarrhea	They have smears in their pants

Terms Used by Family/Friend caregivers to Describe Urinary Incontinence

Bladder problem	They wet their pants
Urine Problem	They can't control their urine
Wetting	Se me sale la orina (the urine is coming out)

Terms Used by Family/Friend Caregivers to Describe Skin Damage Associated with Incontinence

Redness	Skin is broken down
Light pink or pink color	Chapped skin
Discoloration of skin (for Dark-toned skin)	Chaffing
Darker or lighter than usual (for Dark-toned skin)	Raw skin

Rash	Thinning of skin
Inflamed	Cracking or peeling skin
Pimply	Dryness
Blistery	A different texture
Shiny	Excoriated
Soreness	Wound
Irritation	Bleeding
