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

The Board of Trustees' judgement will be final in determining whether a candidate has engaged in positive or negative campaigning. Negative campaigning is not permitted by any candidate or ICS member and will be considered a violation of the ICS Code of Conduct. This policy is in effect at all times and for any position.

During the voting period candidates' application forms will be circulated by the ICS office for all members to view. In addition, the ICS office will periodically contact all ICS members to encourage voting and provide direct links to the voting section of the ICS website.

(200 words maximum)	<p>On the basis of my work in the ICS Standardisation Committee, helping to reshape it into the Standardisation Steering Committee, and as chairman of the Urodynamic Committee, setting the standard for 'evidence based ICS educational activities' in the ICS teaching modules, I see a further challenge to raise the scientific and scholarly activity standards of the Society. As a member of the editorial board of Neurourology and Urodynamics I have been evaluating abstracts for the scientific Meetings since several years and was awarded top 10 reviewer of this journal in 2009, '11, and '14.</p> <p>I bring a critical mind but also the ability to guide to consensus when necessary in committees, also outside ICS, serving as vice-chairman of our university hospital's ethical review board and having worked as project leader in the development wide range of national multidisciplinary guidelines. Furthermore I bring wide-ranging clinical as well as scientific personal experience as may be deduced from my CV.</p> <p>Last but not least I have preserved my scientific independence, and have never been involved in any satellite or directly commercially sponsored lectures at ICS or specialty meetings, and will continue to do so.</p>
