Deputy Scientific Chair - Professor Joanne Booth





The City of Glasgow is pleased to welcome delegates to the city with a drinks reception hosted by our Lord Provost.


Our Gala Scottish Dinner for ICS 2019 with be a traditional Scottish Ceilidh with a twist ..
