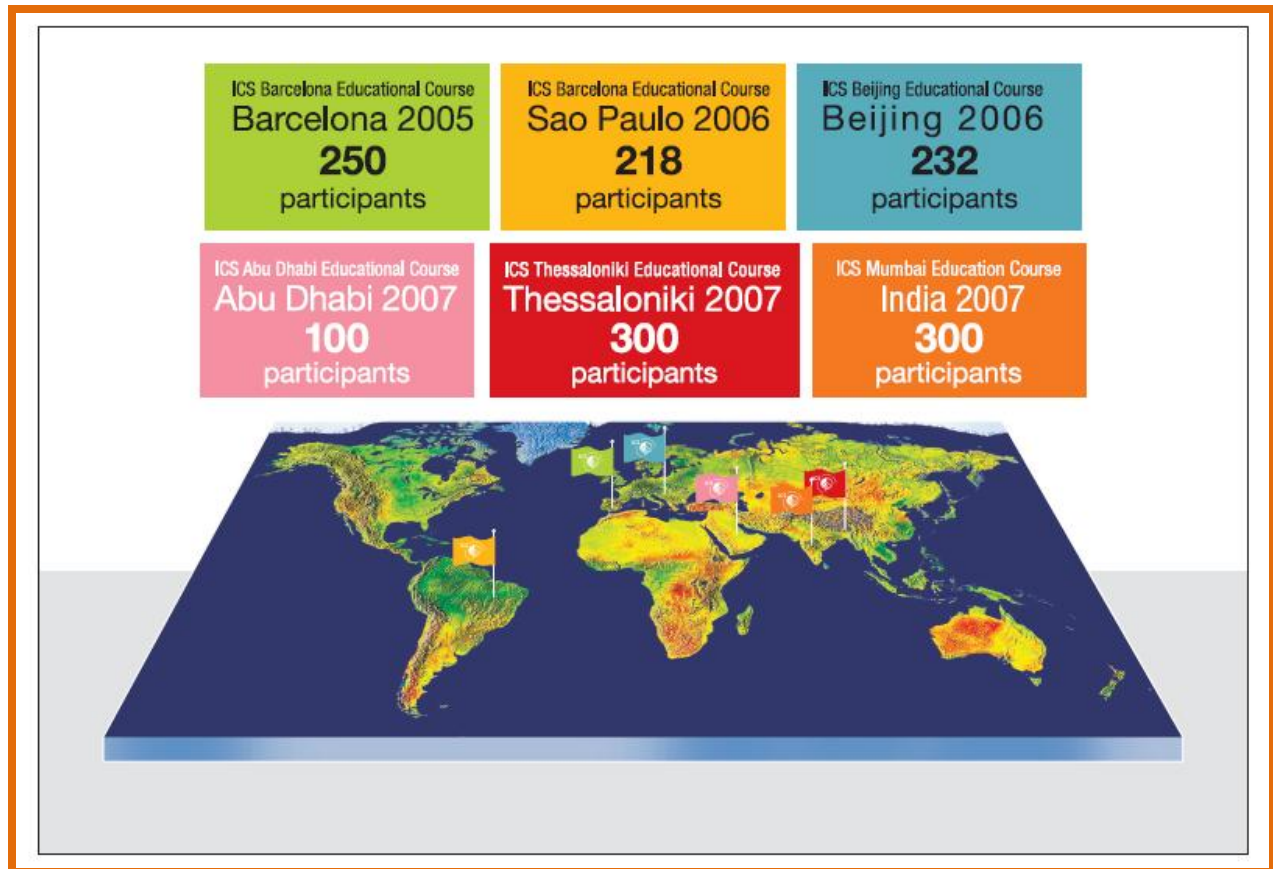

COURSE INFORMATION

The ICS has now held **six** Educational Courses that took place in Barcelona (November 2005), Sao Paulo (July 2006), Beijing (September 2006), Abu Dhabi (January 2007), Thessaloniki (May 2007) and Mumbai (November 2007) and an additional course is due to take place in Berlin (July 2008). These courses attracted between 200 – 300 delegates.



PROFILE OF ATTENDEES

This course, heavily subsidised by the ICS, is intended to appeal to younger doctors, nurses, physiotherapists and scientists who may find it difficult and too expensive to attend the Annual ICS Meeting. The speakers are all internationally recognised in their field. The 2-day programme will inform about the history of the ICS, its standards regarding good urodynamic practice, suggested evidence-based care pathways for the management of incontinence, explanation of which drugs to prescribe for patients with the common overactive bladder syndrome, and which of the many sub-urethral tapes is the most appropriate for patients with stress urinary incontinence.

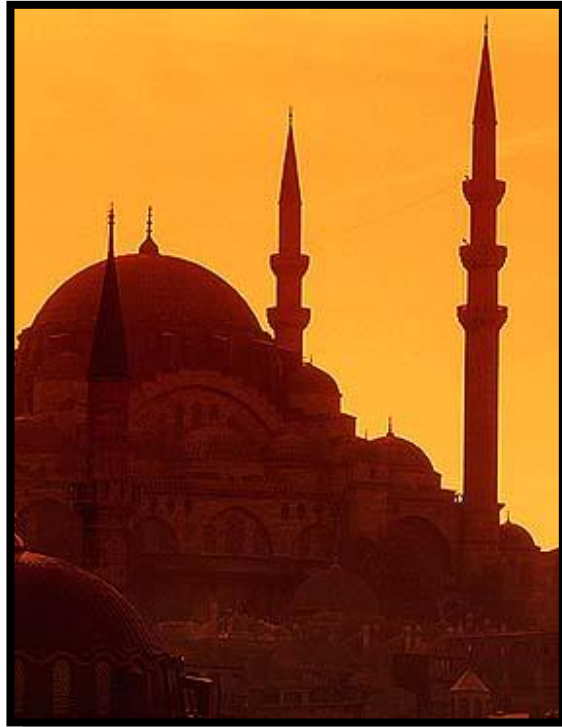

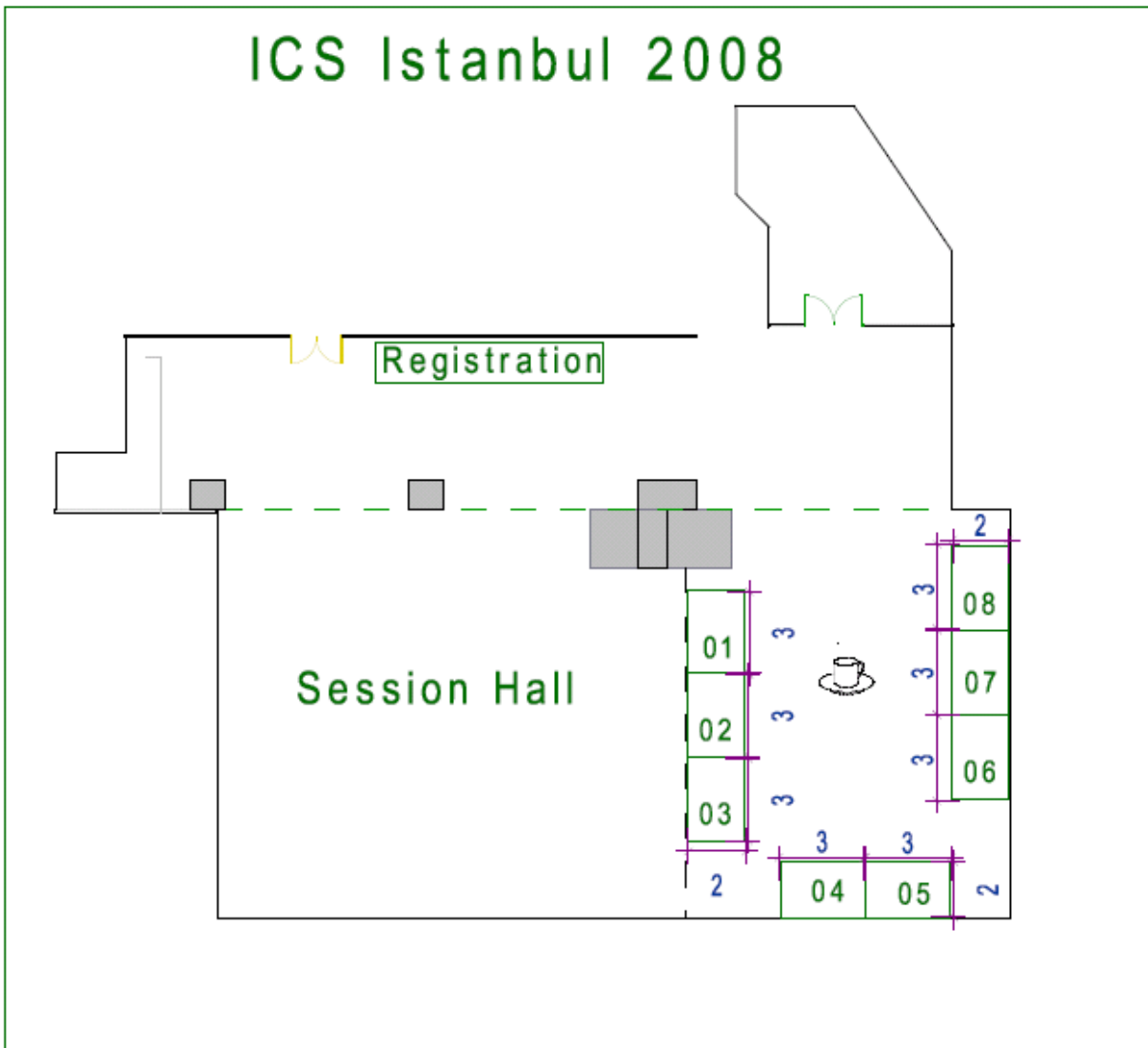

Should the Exhibitor fail to make a payment on time, the Exhibition Manager is entitled to terminate the contract, withdraw confirmation of acceptance, make other arrangements for the stand or seek compensation for non-fulfilment of contract.

Participation by Exhibitors is dependent upon compliance with all rules, regulations and conditions stated herein.

Access to the exhibition is authorized on presentation of a badge issued by the Organizer. Exhibitors' badges will not be mailed in advance and may be collected from the Exhibition Manager's desk.

The Organizer ensures daily cleaning of the aisles. Exhibitors are responsible for the cleaning of their stands.

The provision of refreshments for the participants by Exhibitors is only permitted if the catering regulations of the exhibition building concerned are observed. Exhibition areas and fittings made available to Exhibitors must be handed back in their original condition. In case of damage or loss of equipment provided, or damage to areas occupied, repair and replacement will be charged to the Exhibitor.

Any special decoration or fittings must be submitted to the Organizer for prior authorization.

Advertising panels and display are not permitted outside the exhibition areas allotted to Exhibitors.

The Organizer will not approve stands, which do not comply with the accepted standards, until the necessary changes have been made.
